Identifying Research Opportunities for Libraries and Archives

Independent research:

- The applicant comes up with the who, what, where, why, when of the project;
- The applicant identifies a faculty mentor, PI, affiliate, or supervisor.

Cohort based programs

- Independent research is often a component
- You are part of a cohort of scholars motivated by shared interests or fields

Guided research:

- Summer or postgraduate degree course;
- Contribute to a larger research project, designed and overseen by an expert;
- Fieldwork
- Study abroad



Independent Research (summer+)

Self-designed / faculty guided research experience, project, and practice that will culminate in the fellow's own contribution to the field, discipline, or other supported conclusion in the form of a creative effort.

Undergraduate Research & Fellowships

- I've never done research before—it's too late for me to start.
- I'm curious about research, but I don't have a project. Maybe I'm not cut out for research?
- I don't have a faculty mentor lined up and I don't know anyone who will supervise me. Am I even eligible for this application?
- I don't have a 4.00 GPA; maybe I'm not qualified?
- I want to switch fields of study. I can't conduct research in a field when I know nothing/have had little exposure, can I?
